Homework

English

Reading

Please listen to your child read and ask them questions to support their understanding of the text. Record any reading / discussions in your child's reading diary.

Children should read at home at least four times a week.

<u>Spellings</u>

Please practise your spellings every week for your spelling test. The sheet is available on the school website if you misplace it or forget to take it home.

Handwriting

All children in Woodland Class are expected to join their writing at all times. Please support this by insisting upon this at home. The school website has a link to the 'Join It' site to provide a fun way to practice.

<u>Grammar</u>

When reading books together please look for nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs. The children find these abstract terms difficult so constant reinforcement at home and school will help with this.

Mathematics

Learn Its

Please practice Learn Its regularly - in the car, at tea time, just as they go to bed. The children's homework books will give you guidance on which Learn Its your child needs to concentrate on next.

CLIC

In the homework books I will also give suggestions for an area of CLIC to practice to support your child's progress in maths at school.

Time

Telling the time is a tricky aspect of maths until it clicks. The children who are regularly asked or told the time understand how to use an analogue clock quicker. So please ask your child to tell you the time regularly.
