

# Newsletter – December 2018

Dear Parents / Carers,

December has arrived and with it the cold weather is here. Please make sure the children bring appropriate clothes, e.g. a warm coat, gloves, hat and scarf. As well as getting cold, December is a busy time for everyone, there is lots going on at school and lots going on at home. Included in each separate school's part of the newsletter is a list of dates for the rest of this term to help you plan for the different events we have coming up.

#### **Dinner Money - December**

The price for a child's meal is -£2.10, so a week will cost £10.50. The price of an adult meal is £2.88. The cost of meals for December is -£31.50.

School meals must be paid for in advance, you may either pay weekly, monthly or for the whole half term. **Money must be sent in a clearly labelled envelope, thank you.** 

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils are still receiving universal free school meals so there is no need to pay.

#### Safeguarding Information

#### How to get rid of head lice and nits

Treatments to get rid of head lice are available to buy from pharmacies, supermarkets and online. You don't usually need to see your GP.

The main treatments are:

- lotions or sprays that kill head lice these can be very effective, but some aren't suitable for pregnant or breastfeeding women, or for children under 2
- removing head lice with a specially designed comb this is suitable for everyone and relatively inexpensive, but needs to be repeated several times and can take a long time to do thoroughly

A pharmacist can advise you about the treatments available if you're not sure which is best for you or your child.

Make sure you carefully follow the instructions that come with the treatment you choose. Read more about the <u>treatments for head lice</u>.

**Presentation** – We have a new 'Presentation Policy'. As part of this we have now introduced stickers which are in each child's books reminding them of our expectations for presentation. During the spring term school staff and governors will monitor the presentation in children's books.

#### Joint Events in November

**Creswell Crags (12/11/18) -** The children had a wonderful time, showing great enthusiasm for all the activities. They had a chance to handle Stone-Age artefacts in a cave once lived in by the Stone-age people. They played musical rhythms using ancient style instruments. Another activity involved making shelters using natural materials and then using a variety of natural media to create cave art. All of these activities inspired us to do follow up sessions back at school e.g. story telling; designing and making our own Stone-Age instruments; writing letters of thanks, and our own cave art. This trip was yet another valuable opportunity for the children of both schools to work collaboratively as well as saving transport costs.

**Pizza Express (15/11/18)** – Today our Garden Classes visited Pizza Express in Buxton. All the children became pizza chefs for the morning, creating their own pizza. Whilst the pizzas were cooking the children learnt all about the different foods, they had used, including the Italian words for the foods. The children all enjoyed trying different foods including basil, olives and red onions.
