At our school British Values are an underlying thread of all our teaching. Each of these aspects of our British Values is also used as a theme in assemblies, on an annual basis.

- We treat everybody equally, according to their needs.
- We have high expectations of work and behaviour, depending on pupil's differing needs.
- All children have a chance to lead others, e.g. through PE, mini-leaders, prefects.

• We understand right from wrong.

- We follow our 'Golden Rules' and use our behaviour ladder to show this.
- We use circle time, PSHE and the kindness tree to reinforce this.

• We understand the consequences of our actions.

- Our behaviour ladder gives us clear rewards and sanctions, linked to our 'Golden Rules'.

• We listen to and respect other people's opinions and values.

- We make sure we look at the person who is talking.
- We discuss different topics in circle time.
- In RE we learn about different religions.
- Adults act as role models to demonstrate how to do this.

• We try to help other people.

- At lunchtime we sit in mixed-age groups and the older pupils help the younger pupils.
- Our mini-leaders help younger pupils during lunchtime sports activities.
- We raise money for different charities, e.g. Macmillan, Comic Relief, Red Nose Day.
- Our Harvest donations go to the Padley Centre in Derby.
- At the end of the academic year, Year Six pupils take part in citizenship work.
- Our 'Golden Rules' remind us to help others.
- Our 'Kindness Tree' recognises those who help others.

• We know that we are all special.

- We use R-Time activities to reinforce this.
- We make sure we look at the person who is talking.

• We understand and respect the roles of people who may help us.

- We know that all staff in school help us in different ways.
- We know that outside of school the police, the fire service and the ambulance service can help us.
- We respect the culture and beliefs of others.
- We learn about the beliefs of different religions in RE.
- In circle time and PSHE we discuss respecting different cultures and beliefs.
