## Keeping Our Children Safe: BBC - Tiny Happy People

The BBC have introduced a new area on their website – 'Tiny Happy People'. It may have some useful ideas for you to use. Below is a quote to explain the purpose of the site.

'Tiny Happy People can help you develop your child's language and communication skills, so they get the best start in life.

#### **School Meals**

A child's meal is - £2.10, so a week costs £10.50. The price of an adult meal is £2.88.

The cost of school meals for the Spring 3 half term is - £73.50

School meals must be paid for in advance, you may either pay weekly, monthly or for the whole half term. **Money must be sent in a clearly labelled envelope, thank you.** 

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils are still receiving universal free school meals so there is no need to pay. Meals for children in Years 3 – 6 must be paid for.

Please ensure any money owed this term is paid in full prior to the Christmas holiday.

#### **URGENT: Debts**

Dinner money and after school club costs must be paid for prior to the week that it is intended for. Unfortunately, we will not be able to provide either of these services for your child if payment has not been received in advance.

Having to chase payments adds unnecessary tasks to our administration staff.
