The children will practise basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching and apply these to a range of games. They will also develop their balance, agility and coordination and begin to apply these in a range of activities.

Garden Class Themes

Autumn Term 2021

English

Our text for this term is Goldilocks and the three bears. The children will further develop their understanding of sentence structure and what a sentence needs. We will look at different word classes and apply this learning to make our sentences exciting. We will learn new vocabulary and develop our comprehension skills by re-reading and learning our chosen text orally.

Mathematics

In number the children will be focusing on counting to and across 100 and be able to identify on more or less from any given number. They will also be counting in steps of 2, 3, 5, 10 and recognise the place value of two-digit numbers. The children will focus on number bond facts to 20 and will be looking at adding two digit numbers and subtracting them. They will also cover 2d and 3d shapes and start to use money and combining different amounts together.

PSHE

Over the course of the term the focus will be drug education. The children will learn how to stay healthy including simple hygiene routines to stop germs from spreading. They will explore the roles of medicine and how to stay safe around them. The children will recognise that household products can be harmful and will explore how things that people put in their body can affect how people feel.

RE

The children will look at who Muslims are and what they believe.

Art and Design

The children will look at portraits, with a focus on Picasso and Paul Klee. They will then move on to Landscapes and cityscapes inspired by Monet, Van Gogh and Metzinger.

Geography

The children will learn about the geography of our school and its surrounding area. We will create maps with simple keys to show our local area and use simple compass directions and directional and location language to describe the location of key features. We will also learn about the continents and oceans of the world and how weather changes both seasonally and daily.

Science

The children will learn about living things and their habitats. We will explore the seven life processes and use this knowledge to identify whether things are living, dead or have never been alive. We will learn how habitats provide animals with the things they need to survive.

We will also learn about plants. We will learn to identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants and trees and identify and describe the basic structure of common flowering plants, including trees. We will observe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants and explore what plants need to grow and stay healthy.

History

The children will learn about WWI and Remembrance.
