**Meadow Class Themes
Summer Term 2019**

English

The children will learn the skills involved in understanding and analysing the following styles of text: different forms of poetry with an in depth study of poetry involving the senses; play scripts; stories from other cultures; information texts linked to Geography and Science. They will also have the opportunity to write in these styles.

A daily grammar, vocabulary and punctuation session will be taught, differentiated by ability and age, alongside regular reinforcement of spelling rules using weekly spelling tests.

Mathematics

The children will continue to learn new concepts and to reinforce understanding using problem solving and reasoning.

Year 3 and 4 will study: length, perimeter, area, mass and capacity, position and direction, decimals.

Year 5 and 6 will study: area, percentages, volume, statistics, position and direction

Science

The children will experience outdoor learning through a forest school session every three weeks. Year 3 and 4 will also develop scientific skills through the study of plants: functions of different parts; transportation; life cycle; requirements for healthy plants. Year 5 and 6 will study life cycles of different groups of animals eg mammals, insects, birds and amphibians.

Computing

Year 3 and 4 will then use 'Scratch' to develop programming skills. Year 5 and 6 will use computer programmes to design buildings.

Art / DT

The children will design and make planters to display at the Chatsworth RHS show. They will design and make props and scenery for the Junior Summer production.

Music

The children will continue to develop their knowledge of pitch and musical notation by learning to play the recorder. They will learn to sing some traditional North American songs for the Summer production.

PE

They will develop skills in rounders, cricket, athletics and racket sports. They will develop balance and co-ordination through a daily energise session. They will continue to develop fitness and level of challenge through the 'golden jump or mile'.

French

The children will study vocabulary in connection to outdoors eg garden, sports.

RE

The children will study 'How we can make our village a more respectful place'. They will experience a multi-cultural workshop as part of this.

History/Geography

The children will study North America in terms of its geographical features eg physical, human, trade, resources, map work.

PSHE and RSE

The children will study awareness of Cyber bullying, safety in the sun, on the road and medicine use. Year 5 and 6 will discuss changes during puberty and life cycles of humans. Yr 3 and 4 will discuss relationships; how they have changed since birth; keeping healthy and functions of body parts.
