September

Much of the work done in the first half of the Autumn term has been based around the history topic of Life in Britain from the Stone-Age to Bronze-Age.

In English, the children have been studying the classic story of 'Stig Of The Dump'. Character and setting descriptions and complete stories have been written based on this text.

Artwork has also been linked to this. The children have been experimenting with different mark making using a range of natural media.



The end of September proved to be very busy as the children took part in a harvest festival service at Marston Montgomery Church. They presented information about life as a hunter-gatherer during the Stone -Age. Harvest gifts were donated to the Padley Centre.



On the same day, the older children organised and ran a MacMillan Coffee afternoon. This included advertising, requesting items for sale, making cakes in class and running the stalls. They raised a total of £177.



October

The children participated in a joint day with our federated school - Long Lane C of E Primary. This allowed the children to renew old friendships and do some joint learning about the forthcoming trip to Creswell Crags.

The children also began to study the centenary of World War 1. They studied diary features and then wrote an extract of a diary from the viewpoint of a WW1 soldier.

In science, the children have learned about classification of living things and how to use keys to identify them.

Many of the children produced a homework project based on these topics. This wonderful work was presented at a parent assembly.
