

# Newsletter – April 2019

Dear Parents / Carers,

March was a busy month for both schools. The children have enjoyed two joint events and World Book Day as well as continuing to work hard and make progress. The children completed their termly assessments during March and staff are delighted with the progress that the children have made this term. Well done children for all your hard work.

#### **Dinner Money - Spring Term 4**

The price for a child's meal is - £2.10, so a week will cost £10.50. The price of an adult meal is £2.88. The cost of meals for Spring 4 is £71.40. Please make cheques payable to Derbyshire County Council or DCC. Next term (Summer 5) the cost for meals is £39.90.

School meals must be paid for in advance, you may either pay weekly, monthly or for the whole half term. Payment must be sent in a clearly labelled envelope, thank you.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils are still receiving universal free school meals so there is no need to pay.

### **Breakfast Clubs and After School Clubs**

If your child(ren) is attending Breakfast Club please bring them to the front door (the office door) and wait for a member of staff to answer the door. Thank you.

Children arriving at school prior to **8:45am** when the gate opens should wait outside with their parents. In order to be fair to all parents anyone who drops their child(ren) at school prior to 8:45am will be charged for Breakfast Club.

Children should be collected promptly at **3:30pm**, if you are unable to do this please book your child into After School Club.

Booking forms for the summer term 5 will be sent out this week. Please complete these and return them to school so that we can ensure staff are available when necessary. Thank you.

#### **Reading Bookmarks**

The children in the Garden classroom have been provided with colour band bookmarks for their reading books. The bookmarks are a useful tool for helping your children's reading development at home. The bookmarks recommend useful discussion points and questions to ask your child while reading a text to develop their comprehension skills. Please use these bookmarks and share what you have discussed in their reading diaries for staff at school to see and build on.

#### **Joint Events in March**

**Year 3/4 Splashdown (08/03/19)** – The Acorn Federation entered a team of four children for this event. They took part in a variety of races, using various strokes and showed good team spirit as they did so. Massive congratulations to the children who took part, they came second in the competition!

**Red Nose Day (15/03/19) –** The children joined together today at Marston. The Acorn Federation raised £55 for the charity today.

In the Garden Class, they spent the morning learning about Hassan, a young boy who lives in Sierra Leone. We learned about his life; his family and their home, the foods they eat, the games and activities they enjoy and how Red Nose Day helped them. We compared Hassan's life to our own and created posters to show the similarities and differences. The children then presented their posters to their friends.

On Red Nose Day, the Meadow Classes were inspired by Farhad's Story to create some powerful, brilliant writing. Farhad was a refugee who risked his life, along with his family, to escape the dangers in Syria, by travelling to the safety of Serbia. In the afternoon, they took part in fun activities, including "design your own nose", also word-searches and crosswords based on Red Nose Day clues. It was super to see all of the children working and playing together, raising funds for such an important cause.

**Meadow Class: Islam Workshop (25/03/19) -** The children from both schools had another opportunity to work together when Nahida from the Open Centre came to talk to them about her Muslim faith. She explained how prayer, for Muslims, is an important part of showing respect to God, talking through the rituals of washing before prayer and going through the correct movements into prayer positions. The second part of the workshop gave the children an insight into the important pilgrimage, or religious journey, to Mecca for the Haj, something which is expected of Muslims once in their lifetime, if they can afford it.

The children had the opportunity to ask lots of questions, too!

**Garden Class (25/03/19):** The children had a Maths focus this morning. They took part in a range of activities exploring length, weight and capacity. We weighed objects using balance scales and Numicon; we used measuring scales and learnt to read scales; the children also explored Cuisenaire rods and learnt to compare lengths. We also discussed units of measure.

# Transport to / from joint events

Dear Parents / Carers,

Prior to our last joint event (Red Nose Day), some parents offered to contribute to the cost of the coach. They also wondered if it would be easier for parents to go to the host school at the end of the day instead of the beginning as we now do.

In order for us to find out which arrangements the majority of our parents are happy with we have decided to ask you. Please return your completed surveys to school by 11<sup>th</sup> April. I will look at the completed surveys over the Easter holiday and let you know the results.

## There are a number of options for how we organise transport on joint days.

- 1) Parents take children to the host school, children return on a coach
- 2) A coach takes children to the host school, parents collect from the host school
- 3) Parents take and collect children from the host school
- 4) A coach takes and collects children from the host school

Obviously, the coach has a cost attached to it, on Red Nose Day this cost was £40 for the journey from Marston Montgomery back to Long Lane, a little over £1 per child.

The joint days are an important part of our partnership and provide many benefits to the children, which is why I am happy for school to pay for the transport one way to ease the inconvenience for parents. If we were to start transporting the children in coaches both ways we would need to ask for a voluntary contribution to these days.

Below I have listed the different options for transporting children to the joint events along with a variety of ways we could charge for this. Please complete the list by ordering them starting at 1 with your favourite preference. Any options that you would not be happy with please put a cross in that box.

contribute to the cost of both journeys
