PΕ

The children will practise basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching and apply these to a range of games. They will also develop their balance, agility and coordination and begin to apply these in a range of activities.

RΕ

During the summer term, the children will be exploring two key questions: Who do Christians say made the world? and How should we care for the world and for others, and why does it matter?

Computing

The children will learn what algorithms are and how they are implemented as programs on digital devices. They will learn to create and debug simple programs and use logical reasoning to predict the behaviour of simple programs.



Garden Class Themes Summer Term 2021

English

Our texts for this term are Dear Dinosaur and Supertato. We will continue to look at different word classes and apply this learning to make our sentences exciting. We will explore new punctuation and begin to apply this in our own writing. We will learn new vocabulary and continue to develop our comprehension skills by re-reading and learning our chosen texts orally.

Mathematics

In measurement, the children will explore length and height, capacity and volume and time. We will also learn to multiply and divide practically, pictorially and mentally and become confident in recalling multiplication facts for the 10, 5 and 2 multiplication tables.

PSHE

Over the course of the term, the children will explore the importance of being responsible, identifying how we can contribute to the life of the classroom, school and our local environment. We will explore the importance of rules and recognise what is fair/unfair, right/wrong and kind/unkind.

We will also learn about bullying, recognising that our behaviour, actions and words can hurt others. We will learn to recognise when people are unkind to us or others, who to tell and what to say.

History

The children will learn about the Great Fire of London.

Art and Design

The children will use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination.

Design and Technology

The children will explore and use mechanisms to create a moving picture.

Geography

The children will learn to name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom. We will use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features of the four countries and capital cities.

Science

The children will learn about living things and their habitats. We will explore the seven life processes and use this knowledge to identify whether things are living, dead or have never been alive. We will learn how habitats provide animals with the things they need to survive.

We will also learn about plants. We will learn to identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants and trees and identify and describe the basic structure of common flowering plants, including trees. We will observe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants and explore what plants need to grow and stay healthy.
